

# **Early Head Start Facts and Figures** A Proven Support for Children, Pregnant Women, and Families



Through year-round, full-day services in centers, as well as home-based options, **its impact is undeniable**.

## By the Numbers

**166,693** Federally funded Early Head Start slots



Only 11% of eligible children and their families had access.






**2,729** classrooms in the United States

### Enrollment

In 2018-19, Early Head Start served children 0-3 and pregnant women through 166,693 slots in all 50 states and territories. Throughout the year, a total of 224,436 infants and toddlers and 14,945 pregnant women participated in Early Head Start.

#### Access


There are approximately four times fewer Early Head Start slots than Head Start slots, which prevents our nation's most vulnerable learners from experiencing a continuum of quality care during the critical prenatal to five period. Early Head Start Rising is NHSA's campaign to <u>raise</u> <u>Early Head Start slots</u> to at least equal the number of Head Start slots.



#### Program Types

Early Head Start provides extensive options to meet the needs of working parents.

- 94% of center-based slots are 5 days/ week for more than 6 hours/day.
- Half of the center-based slots can serve children for more than 10 hours/day.
- Home-based services include a 90minute home visit every week and at least 22 group socializations with other families each year.
- Programs follow Head Start Program
  Performance Standards
- Teachers are required to have a minimum of a Child Development Associate credential and training with a focus on infant and toddler development.



#### Early Head Start Improves Well-Being

- Children in Early Head Start are more likely to be immunized and to receive services if they have a diagnosed disability.
- Early Head Start children show significantly better socialemotional, language, and cognitive development.
- For families in the child welfare system, children enrolled in Head Start are 93% less likely to be placed in foster care.

Early Head Start is rooted in equity, supporting those from the most at-risk backgrounds. Through a comprehensive model of support for the whole child and whole family, Early Head Start serves as a buffer to prevent and address childhood trauma, hunger, poor health, and other outcomes associated with growing up in poverty, and which disproportionately affect children of color.


